#### About the Role:

We are seeking a dedicated and versatile individual to join our team in a dual role as **Cook and Casual After School Club Assistant**. This is a rewarding opportunity for someone who enjoys working with children and has a passion for preparing nutritious meals in a safe and welcoming environment.

The successful candidate will be responsible for supporting the planning and the preparation of healthy meals and snacks for children aged 4-11 years, as well as supporting the delivery of engaging and inclusive activities during after school sessions as required based on booking numbers. This role requires flexibility, creativity, and a genuine interest in child development and wellbeing.

### **Key Responsibilities:**

# **Cooking & Kitchen Duties:**

- Plan meals alongside club supervisors, prepare, and serve healthy, balanced meals and snacks in line with dietary guidelines and individual needs (including allergies and intolerances).
- Maintain high standards of food hygiene and cleanliness in accordance with current legislation (e.g., Food Standards Agency).
- Monitor and record cleaning schedules, and stock rotation.
- Order and manage food supplies within budget, ensuring minimal waste.
- Ensure the kitchen and food preparation areas are clean, safe, and well-organised at all times.

### **After School Club Support:**

- Assist in the supervision and care of children during after school sessions, ensuring a safe, nurturing, and stimulating environment.
- Support the planning and delivery of a wide range of activities including arts and crafts, sports, games, reading, and free play.
- Build positive relationships with children, encouraging social interaction, creativity, and confidence.
- Promote positive behaviour and manage any incidents in line with the club's behaviour policy.

- Help with setting up and tidying away equipment and resources before and after sessions.
- Communicate effectively with parents/carers, providing feedback and ensuring a welcoming atmosphere.

- Experience in food preparation and/or working in a kitchen environment.
- Experience working with children in a professional or voluntary capacity.
- Basic Food Hygiene Certificate (or willingness to obtain).
- Understanding of safeguarding and child protection principles.

- Good communication and interpersonal skills.
- Reliable, punctual, and flexible in approach.
- Willingness to undertake an enhanced DBS check.

#### Desirable:

- Paediatric First Aid Certificate.
- Level 2 or above qualification in Childcare, Playwork, or similar.
- Knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) or school-age childcare frameworks.
- Experience supporting children with additional needs or dietary requirements.
