Funding News

Funding News from our Operations and Projects Manager, Angela Watt



We are now a registered charity and this has opened

up new opportunities for funding and donations. We have received grants from existing funders and stakeholders, but also applied for new grants which will sustain the Forum and provide the invaluable support to our members, parent carers and families.

We have been awarded £2,750 from West Sussex County Council Prevention and Wellbeing Grant. This has enabled us to provide an experienced Parent Carer Rep as Project Co-ordinator to meet with and support our volunteers. We're delighted that Denise Berry has taken on this role and you can contact her on deniseberry@wspcf.co.uk

We've also received confirmation of the second part of our Contact a Family, Parent Participation Grant for £7,500 which originates from the Department of Education. This grant enables our membership and parent carers to participate in events, workshops and training, as well as information, marketing and outreach work.

The Forum continue to be supported by West Sussex County Council and Clinical Commissioning Groups. We provide trained volunteers to attend meetings/events and co-produce new ideas and decisions which affect parent carers and their families. We've built strong relationships with health, education and social care professionals working alongside them and providing an insight into what is involved with being a parent carer. This has also evolved into paid project work for our experienced Parent Representatives.

Thank you to everyone who donated their green coins to our box in Littlehampton Waitrose recently which raised £318.

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New West Sussex Disabled Young People's Forum

This is a new Forum to ensure that in West Sussex we listen to what disabled children and young people say about what matters to them and make sure adults in charge take their views and interests into account.

This Forum will be consulted on a wide range of issues and will also be able to contribute their own ideas.

We know that not all young people will be comfortable in groups or formal meetings and there will be lots of different ways to contribute. Information will be available in many different formats including symbol systems and iPads and our staff are experienced in supporting people with complex communication needs.

If your child would like to be on our list of Forum members we would send details of consultation opportunities, this might be coming to an event, returning a questionnaire, or meeting one of our staff to say what you think. We hope our Forum members will also tell us how they like to be consulted and participate in decision making.

We will produce regular newsletters detailing the issues the Young Peoples Forum has contributed to and the outcomes that have been achieved.

Sensory Bus Project

On behalf of West Sussex County Council Short Breaks, the Forum is managing the refurbishment of the Sensory Bus as it has a rather tired interior and the wish from the parents and professionals alike, is that it needs more interactive play and be more accessible to various groups of children.

I have visited a number of sensory rooms and facilities and have now requested a quotation from a company who are also in a position to refurbish the bus. I have engaged the help of two volunteer mothers, Louise and Inga, to assist in looking at the sensory toys that will go on the bus as well. This will ensure that the bus has its own toys. We are also looking for voluntary drivers, and two people have responded so far. One of the main reasons for underuse of the bus, was the lack of drivers. We also need to make sure that the bus can reach out



to as many organisations, schools and early years settings as possible, to ensure that many children across the County can have a wonderful sensory experience.

We would like to launch the new bus at the next PACE event on Saturday 15th November 2014.

A Service of Choice: Future Changes to the Child Disability Service

The West Sussex Child Disability Service is to be redesigned to enable disabled children, young people and their families to exercise more choice and control over the services they receive. In the redesign we aim to ensure that:

- Families receive the right level of support at the right time.
- Families will not have to repeat their story in order to find out if the help available is right for them.
- A service which offers a 'lighter touch' support, empowering families to determine which services are best to achieve the best outcomes for their disabled children/young people.
- A service which will be the point of contact for the family and practitioners seeking advice and support for a disabled child or young person.
- A support service with skilled and knowledgeable staff

- who will know about what matters to disabled children, young people and their families.
- Annual reviews are held which include the disabled child/ young person, significant family members and relevant practitioners.

We will be adopting a phased approach to the redesign over the next six months. Parent carers are involved in the planning of the service.

We welcome your views, please talk to Denise Berry or Niki Websdale at the West Sussex Parent Carer Office and they will pass them on to us. We will keep you updated on how things are going in future newsletters.

Thoughts on the SEND Reforms Now We Are in a New World...

The Children & Families Act became law on 1st September and Part 3 concerns children and young people aged 0-25, with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) as detailed in the new Code of Practice. You will start to see changes and need to know what is happening and, if it affects you, what to do and where to get information.

West Sussex Local Offer is in place so have a lookhttp://westsussex.local-offer.org. Visit the website, it's not just a directory of services; you can personalise viewings, save your results and leave comments.

At school, class teachers must know about differing needs and the support needed to meet your child's **Outcomes**.

Using the Mental Capacity Act

urce for families and friends of with learning disabilities

There remains a 'graduated approach' to supporting every child to reach their Outcomes. This is about Outcomes not Hours with much more emphasis on Assess, Plan, Do, Review for every child and working together with you and your child/young person to do that. All the support your child had previously will still be there. There are many ways to reach an Outcome and you are part of that conversation.

School Action/School Action
Plus are now one category called
SEN Support. The legal definition
of SEN has not changed in the
new law. If your child has
significant needs they may need
an Education Health and
Care plan (or Statements of

SEN pre 1st September). **EHCp's**

differ to Statements of SEN mainly in that they focus towards Outcomes. If there are Social Care and Health issues that affect your child's education they will be brought into their plan. Children become Young People at 16 years old in this law. If your young person has significantly complex needs and they remain in Full-time Education, their EHCp can continue until they are 25 years old. And you will be offered the option of a **Personal Budget** to help meet your child's Outcomes, if they cannot be supported by their EHCp. So, the option of a Personal Budget will only be relevant to a small number of families.


Transfers of Statements to EHCps Pathfinder EHCp, Statements in Years 2, 6, 11 and 14

There are approximately 3,400 Statements to TRANSFER in West Sussex and this will happen in a timetabled way. If your child has a **Pathfinder EHCp** or is in **Year 2, 6 11 or 14** (aged phase transfer) their Statements will be transferred

this year to EHCp. Your thoughts and aspirations for your child (as well as young people's own views) will be actively collected and included so it's important to get involved.

Post16 specific support

The Post 16 or Preparing for Adulthood world is new for many services. New processes have to be put in place as FE Colleges have never done Annual Reviews or been familiar with Statements. The *www.yourspacewestsussex.co.uk* website has revived activity and WSCC are planning some information events.



Want to know more? Places for support and information?

Work with your child's **School/College** to collect views (yours and theirs) and understand the process.

Parent Partnership Service - Officers and Independent Parental Supporters (trained volunteers) can support you. PPS now fulfils the role of the Independent Advice and Support Service (set out in the new Code of Practice) 0845 075 1008.

Independent Supporters - AMAZE will have six <u>Independent Supporters</u> in West Sussex but this service won't be for everyone, and certain criteria will apply.

At the next Parent Carer Action Group on Wednesday 22nd October (details on back page) there will be the opportunity to meet the organisations involved in supporting families going through Transfers (from Statements to EHCp) or Statutory Needs Assessment. Meet the new Independent Supporters from Amaze Brighton, the Parent Partnership Service and SEN Assessment & Planning Team Leader.

Hello I'm Jane Binns and I'm delighted to have recently joined the West Sussex Parent Carer Forum as Project Manager for the PACT Awards on this exciting new scheme.

What are the PACT Awards?

If you haven't heard about them, The Parent

and Carer Team 'PACT Award' rewards excellence in services for children and young people with disabilities or additional needs across the County. Run by West Sussex Parent Carer Forum, it is an award with a difference as it is given by local parents and carers for local parents and carers and focuses on areas that families have told us are most important to them when choosing which services or activities to access, including:

- Staff attitude
- Environment
- Safety
- Communication, Information and Feedback
- Involvement, Inclusion and Participation
- Policies and Procedures

An organisation is rated Bronze, Silver, or Gold standard depending on their facilities and service. We are supported by West Sussex County Council and this funding includes PACT Award assessments of the Children and Families Centre Hubs and activity organisations funded by Short Breaks.

How the Awards can help you?

The purpose of the PACT Awards is to help parents and carers from across the County make informed choices about which services they use for their children.

Why should services get involved?

A PACT Award is a clear way to demonstrate that an organisation offers excellence in the provision of services for disabled children and young people.

Who has an Award?

We're delighted to announce that we have so far awarded 5 Awards, all of them silver, to the following providers:

- Worthing Leisure
- Enable Me
- Springboard Horsham
- Chanctonbury Community Playscheme
- Impulse Leisure Lancing

They have been through a rigorous assessment carried out by two of our PACT Award Assessors who

are fully trained, but who are also parent carers, and therefore know exactly what to look for in a service.





These providers can now proudly display their certificates and window stickers and also carry the PACT Awards logo on their website, demonstrating that they show a commitment and ability to providing an excellent service.

What happens next?

More assessments are being carried out over the next few months, look at the website or in the next newsletter for more news. We will be marketing the PACT Awards locally so hopefully you will see more information around the County.

This free event for parents and carers was organised by WSPCF, WSCC, Sussex Community Trust, NHS and Short Breaks and took place in June at Fontwell.



Peter Evans, Cabinet Member, started the day expressing the importance of communication for everyone. Bella Cobby (SEND Hub Development Officer) and Lara Roberts (WSPCF), shared news about all the SEND Hubs and the great work happening

in the county supporting children with all additional needs.



Compass, the SEND Hub based at QEII School Horsham was introduced. This SEND Hub has expertise and a specialist knowledge of Alternative & Augmentative Communication (AAC). Its

The day ended on a high with Oak Grove College giving an outstanding singing signing performance and there was also a presentation from a youth club which everyone enjoyed.

There were around 30 stalls with a range of information at hand for any type of communication need as well as workshops and taster sessions on variety of topics including eating and drinking, intensive interaction, sensory stories, social stories, visual aids, 'Go', a game where all can join in and a session on switch capability and mobility potential. Speech and Language Therapists were on hand all day for one-to-one sessions with parents.



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Re-design of Emotional Health and Wellbeing Services for Children and Young People

Nationally and locally there is an increasing demand for services for children and young people who require emotional and mental health support. Consultations and a Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (http://jsna.westsussex.gov.uk/ JSNA-Reports) have revealed concerns about the range and quality of provision available, and service users have told us that they do not always receive the support they want or need.

In partnership with service users, families and providers the Children and Families Commissioning Team is responding to the findings and the national trends reflected locally, by considering how services could be re-shaped to provide better outcomes for children and young people.

The re-design project team is working hard to deliver services that build resilience and emotional well-being for children, young people and their families and that assess potential problems early. Following effective assessment, the aim is to ensure that appropriate interventions are available to bring about the best possible outcomes.

With these aims in mind a set of principles have been agreed which will underpin service commissioning and delivery. These principles emphasise an outcomes-based approach, and health promotion, as outlined in 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' (www.neweconomics.org/projects/entry/five-ways-to-well-being). Making sure that needs are identified early and services are available and relevant for all young people, including those looked after, and those with disabilities, is

another fundamental principle. We also recognise that children and young people change, as do need and demand and therefore services must be flexible and responsive to those changes. Alongside these is a commitment to clear and consistent communication within and between service users, professionals, commissioners and providers and that this is enabled by close and regular collaboration.

The project team has been asked by its Management Board to deliver re-design proposals to an ambitious timeframe. By January 2015, the team will have consulted with numerous stakeholders, including service users, to consider what the re-designed service should deliver and how. The proposals will be supported by a clinical evidence base provided by a Clinical Reference Group, and informed by a financial analysis and forecast.

Once the Management Board is satisfied with the proposals, further formal consultations are required with stakeholders including satisfying governance requirements for the Clinical Commissioning Groups and West Sussex County Council. The next step after that is to undertake a procurement exercise to secure the highest quality delivery of the specifications.

It is anticipated that the process from January to new service delivery will take approximately 10 months.
