**Forest School experiences** - We are so grateful to the PTA for giving school money to provide all children in school with the opportunity to take part in termly Forest School experiences. Children from Reception right up to Year 6 thoroughly enjoy their time appreciating and learning about our wonderful environment, as well as trying out new skills using tools and natural resources. We believe that Forest school inspires our children to care for our natural world as well as fosters independence, builds resilience, nurtures self-esteem and encourages a healthy lifestyle.

We would like to expand this programme of Forest Schools even further over the next year. Thank you also to the teams of regular parent volunteers, who help out during these sessions too. So many parents have spoken to me about how beneficial a part of our

curriculum they think it is.

















This week, we also had a Senior School's Adviser from the Diocese visit school, as this term, we are due a Section 48 Inspection; this is an Inspection carried out by the Church of England. During the inspection, the inspector will be looking at collective worship and the impact it has on our children's lives, the teaching of RE in school, academic standards, the wellbeing and behaviour of our children. The inspection will focus on the Christian distinctiveness of our school and how our school vision drives everything we as a school do. The inspector will observe RE lessons, talk to children, parents and staff, monitor pupil books and find out the impact we as a school have on our children, families, local, wider and global community and how well we care about our world and the people in it. I am very pleased to report that the Senior Adviser was very pleased with the high standards she saw in RE books and walking around school she felt that our school vision was very evident. It was reassuring to have such a positive and successful visit before our inspection arrives.
